Monday Memorial Feast of the Basilicas of Sts Peter and Paul

Built about 330 by the Emperor Constantine. St Paul's Basilica was built at the end of the 4th Century.
The two sites have been the centres of pilgrimage honouring the two great Apostles.

Thursday Memorial presentation of the **Blessed Virgin Mary** by her parents.

Friday - St Cecilia a Roman martyr of the 3rd century. According to tradition she was a young
Christian betrothed to a pagan Her husband became a Christian and his brother- both were martyred .
Soon afterwards St Cecilia was arrested but on refusing to honour pagan gods she was beheaded.
St Cecilia is the patron of music.
