**Feasts this week**

**Monday St Fabian** Pope and martyr. In the year 236 he was chosen as Pope. He was martyred in the year 250 at the beginning of the persecution of Christians by Decius.

**Tuesday St Agnes** Virgin and martyr. She refused to deny her faith and suffered martyrdom under the persecution of Diocletian

**Wednesday St Vincent** Deacon, Martyred in Spain. He died in Valencia also during the Diocletian persecution.

**Friday St Francis De Sales** He worked in Switzerland teaching people how to understand the faith. He became Bishop of Geneva soon after and his gentle ministry won many people over - he wanted to help the ordinary people become holy. He is the patron saint of writers,

**The Ordinary Time Of The Year**

It is tempting to think that the Ordinary Time got its name because it is, well, ordinary or non-exceptional but that is not really the case.

Ordinary Time means ordered and is derived from ordinal numbers (first, second, third etc) as opposed to cardinal numbers (one, two, three)

The weeks are counted or ordered from January to November - except during Lent and Easter, up to Advent. The last Sunday of Ordinary Time is the Feast of Christ the King.
