Memorial Feasts during the week

Monday 8th The Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary -

we celebrate the dawn of our salvation in the birth of Mary, Mother of our Saviour.



Tuesday 9th St Peter Claver - born 1580 - a Spanish Jesuit priest, served in the Spanish colonies for
40 years. He ministered to the enslaved- considering himself 'a slave in the service of God.'
He was canonised by Pope Leo XIII in 1885.

Wednesday 10th St Ambrose Barlow- born 1585 in Chorlton-cum- Hardy. He became a Benedictine
monk in 1614 in very hazardous times for Catholic clergy. He travelled around Lancaster, despite
several arrests, celebrating Mass and ministering to the poor. He was captured, having suffered a
stroke, and he was hanged, drawn and quartered at Lancaster Castle in 1641.
